

AISL ANNOUNCES 2010 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS TEAM

Mr Nick Sullivan of AISL has announced the World Championships Rifle Team to contest the championships in Munich during July/August. The potential team members have worked through 3 selection events, and attained an AISL Performance Qualifying Score at least once this year (in the case of senior shooters).

Number 1 Australian ranked prone shooter, and winner of numerous World Cup medals (including the recent Sydney World Cup) and an Olympic Bronze medal, Warren Potent has been nominated to shoot in the Mens 50m Prone event. This selection was highly expected due to Warren dominance of 50m prone shooting in Australia. Being multi-skilled, Warren is also competing in the 300m Prone event.



Australia's number 1 ranked female shooter, Robyn Van Nus, has also had her team berth confirmed. This comes after solid performances in the Commonwealth Shooting Federation Championships (with two medals) and a gold medal in the Women's Prone and a 3P finals berth and 4th place in the recent Sydney World Cup. Robyn will shoot in two disciplines — her favourite 3P & Air.



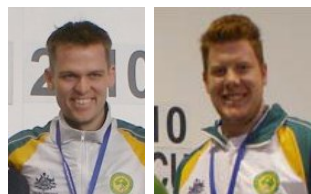
The Junior Women's Team is comprised of Alethea Sedgeman (VIC) & Alice Styles (ACT). Both girls performed well in the Selection events, with Alethea closely shadowing Robyn in the final results. The World Championships will be their first event at this high level and all of them are training in earnest until the departure date in mid July. Alethea, & Alice will shoot all three disciplines—3P, Air & Prone.



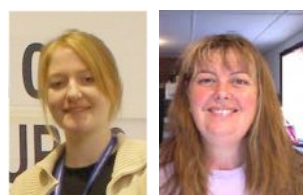
The Junior Men Team comprises John Coombes (ACT), Edwin Gouw (SA) & Thomas Versace (QLD). John is a newcomer to this level of shooting.

A talented young shooter, John has specialised in Air Rifle and performed extremely well in all the Selection events. Edwin is also an Air Rifle specialist who has excelled in recent events. He is a quiet young man who, although an

Australian citizen, spends much of his time in Singapore. Thomas is the more experienced shooter of the trio, and a prone specialist, who has been often seen on the podium at the TRA National Championships.



Will Godward (SA) & Tyren Vitler (WA) round out the smallbore team and will compete in their first World Championships. Tyren is an Air Rifle specialist, and Will is an all round Air & 3P shooter, with a preference for 3P. Both guys have been seen on the podium in many of the Aus Cup competitions, and TRA Nationals in their respective events.



Joining Will and Tyren are women's prone specialists Jennifer Hens (NSW) and Debbie Lowe (SA). This is the first world championships for the quiet NSW shooter who has produced some excellent scores throughout the past year. Debbie is more experienced at this level of competition, having been previously to a World Championships. Both shooters are keen to continue Australia's prone success.

To complete the 300m team with Warren, well known NSW smallbore shooters David Hollister and Maris Taylor will head to Munich and compete in the 300m Prone event.
