## MARCH PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Welcome everyone to the TRA March Newsletter.

Congratulations to Jack Rossiter for picking up the ball to look after promotions and marketing for TRA, which encompasses looking after the production of this newsletter. This is the second newsletter Jack has produced, following the February edition, which was very well received. Jack is also putting product onto our Facebook page, and he has got an Instagram page functioning as well, and is also looking at possibly using other forms of social media. From Monday 3 April, the TRA National Championships programme commences with the first competition starting on Tuesday and finishing the following Monday. Western Australia is a long distance to travel, and flight costs at the moment are reasonably high making it restrictive to some. For all the competitors who have entered, I thank you for supporting what will be a terrific Championship event. Good luck to all the competitors, and also those seeking selection to the ISSF World Championships in Baku, Azerbaijan, with these Championships playing host to the second of four selection events. In Australia, like other parts of the world, we have all been suffering from a lack of ammunition supply, due to a number of global factors. But, as you may be aware, stocks are now on the increase again after receiving two shipments of Eley ammunition within six weeks of each other, with another due hopefully before the end of July, and then a further shipment later in the year.

Also, following rumours that the Australian distributor for RWS ammunition had changed, TRA made inquiries and was able to confirm that it is now being distributed by Beretta Australia. We have established a dialogue with them, and are now finalising a purchasing arrangement to get the best price for our members.

With interest, funding and involvement from the Australian Sports Commission, Shooting Australia and Target Rifle Australia, there has been a programme running in Queensland, South Australia and now Western Australia called the Target Shooting Sports Partnership Project (TSPP). This is a program using optical firearms that can be made accessible to the general public in an environment away from rifle range, but under supervision. It has been used very successfully last year in Queensland at the Maryborough Agricultural Show, garnering a lot of attention and 6 new members for the Maryborough Smallbore Club. There is also a very successful schools programme with an inter-schools target sprint competition coming up in July. From around August last year to now, across all the involved states, there have been over 3800 participants 'having a go', and I haven't been made aware of a single negative coming away from it. What a great exposure to the sport of target shooting!



#### Junior Air Rifle Clubs

The concept behind the Junior Clubs for target rifle shooting is simple – a club environment for young people to develop the skills of shooting in an environment that is both supportive, enjoyable and age appropriate. It is about becoming more like other sports which have age group teams for young people to compete and socialise within – rather than our current model of expecting young people to fit into an adult club system.




#### Why Air Rifle?

Air rifle shooting is cheap, quiet, and recognised internationally as the "introductory" discipline that is good for developing the skills of target shooting. This fits with the Shooting Australia Athlete Pathway, that shows a progression of how athletes enter the shooting sports, and how they are supported throughout.



#### Clubs

Junior Clubs are part of the main club but should operate at a separate time to the senior club. They need to be fully supported by the senior members of the club and staffed by coaches who will provide appropriate supervision of the young shooters as well as guidance for improvement. All Coaches who support Junior Clubs need to have Working with Children Checks and be up to date with the new Child Safe Policies that are on the TRA website under policies.

## **CLUB CAPTURE - SHEPPARTON SMALLBORE** & AIR RIFLE CLUB



Shepparton was the host of the 2021 TRA National Championships. This event was very successful in showcasing the capability of this small club and was an important event in the preparation for the Tokyo 2020 Olympic rifle team.

#### Shepparton club history:

• 1977 Club was formed, Don Pethybridge was the main driving force, Don shot fullbore, small bore and pistol as well. Some or all of the founding members of the club were John Neumann, Col Saxton, Peter Peirce, Barry Porter, Ken Doherty and Jim Reither.

• 1978 The apprentices from Shepparton technical college assisted building a lot of the club. Pistol Club members Bill and Graeme Waite, Tom Braumann and were also involved in it's construction.

· 1979 Club held its first Prize Meeting

· 1984 new members included Karen Hancox, Reg Wells, Daryl and Liz Jones, Richard Smout, Craig Cameron, Chris Lott, Michael Spencer, Barry and Chris Porter.

 1990 Air Rifle shed was built, club changed name to Shepparton Small Bore and Air Rifle, there was approximately 40 members at this point, and around 30 shooting each club night

Shepparton as a club is involved in many local & rural competitions. Club members for years had an annual pilgrimage up to West Wyalong for their annual Prize Meeting, there was a number of car loads who would head up and compete, this was a great social trip where many fond memories were made.

Shepparton revitalized another interclub competition called the Neumann Shield which is shot at 50m between Kyabram and Shepparton and this event is still enjoyed by both clubs.

- 2023 Purchased and installing another 5 Meyton Electronic Targets, as well as polythermal bullet catchers
