BAKU WORLD CUP 2ND OF MAY UNTIL 11TH OF MAY



At this World Cup, a total of 699 athletes competed, including Jack Rossiter and Dane Sampson in the men's 10m Air Rifle Match and two 50m 3 Position matches and Charlotte Bland in the women's 10m Air Rifle. Jack and Charlotte also represented Australia in the 10m Air Rifle Mixed Teams event. Jack Rossiter delivered an impressive performance, making it to two finals: he placed 5th in 10m Air Rifle with a score of 187.4 and 8th place in 50m 3 Position with a score of 406.0.

The world cup started with the 10m Air Rifle Mixed team where Charlotte shot a score of 313.9 and Jack 311.8 with a combined total of 625.7, placing them in 26th position. The cut off to make the bronze medal match was a 630.3.

The following day Jack, Dane and Charlotte competed in the 10m Air Rifle Qualification. First up was the Men's event, where Dane finished on 627.3 finishing in 38th place, and Jack with a 630.5 to place him in 8th and qualify him for the finals, where he came away with 5th place. Charlotte's match shortly followed, where she shot a 623.9 to finish in 69th place. The cut off for the women's finals was 631.2. A new women's qualifying world record of 636.3 was shot by the Chinese athlete Jiayu Han.





The next event was the first round of 50m 3 Positions which both Dane and Jack competed in. In the first qualification, Dane Sampson shot a 587 to place 20th and Jack Rossiter with a 592 to place 4th and make a second finals for this World Cup with the cut-off for this final being 590. In the final Jack placed 8th in a final in which there was a World Record set by Yukun Liu of 467.3 and a Junior World Record of 466.1 by Linshu Du, both of which were Chinese athletes.

In the second round of 50m 3 Position for the men's Dane came in 13th place with a 585 and Jack in 54th with a 575. A 588 was the cut-off score for the finals. In these finals Yukun Liu was able to beat the World Record he had just set a few days before with a 468.9



MUNICH WORLD CUP 31ST OF MAY UNTIL 8TH OF JUNE

Shortly after the ISSF World Cup in Baku, athletes were off to the Munich World Cup. This was the first time Munich had held a World Cup in 5 years! Athletes Jack Rossiter and Dane Sampson competed in both 10m Air Rifle and 50m 3 Position in the Men's events and in the Women's, Charlotte Bland for 10m Air Rifle and Olivia Cartwright for 50m 3 Position. Jack and Charlotte also teamed up to represent Australia in the 10m Air Rifle Mixed Teams event. We saw great efforts from both our junior shooters Charlotte and Olivia shooting a personal best in their events amongst some incredibly high scores from other competitors!

To start off the rifle events for the Munich World Cup was the Air Rifle Men's, where many high scores were shot, with a 630.0 only placing 23rd. Dane finished in 36th place with a score of 628.8 and Jack in 58th with a 626.6. A score of 631.4 was the cut off score for the men's finals. In these finals Lihao Sheng shot a Junior World Record and World Record of 254.5.

Following the men's event, Charlotte competed in the Women's 10m Air Rifle Qualification which saw even higher scores with a 630.0 only placing in 26th and the finals cut off being 632.5. Charlotte had a great performance, finishing with a 625.0 and a personal best at a world cup, placing in 90th. A new Junior Qualifying World Record of 635.3 was set by China's Yuting Huang.

The last 10m Air Rifle event was the Mixed Teams, where Jack and Charlotte represented team Australia shooting a combined total of 625.1 to place in 35th. Jack shot an individual score of 313.2 and Charlotte 311.9. The bronze medal match cut off was 632.5 and China set a new Qualifying Junior World Record of 635.3.

Following the air rifle events was the 50m 3 Position events. First up was the women's elimination round where Olivia shot a new personal best of 576, however this was unfortunately not enough to make it through to the qualification round placing in 45th. In this match, Swiss junior Emely Jaeggi equalled the Qualifying World Record and set a new Junior World Record of 596.

Next was the men's event. With Jack shooting a 587 to place 11th and Dane a 582 to place in 24th, both making it through to the qualification round. Here Jack finished on a 586 in 36th place and Dane 582 to come in 24th place.

After the selection events for the 2024 Olympics in Sydney and Adelaide, I secured the top spot in the women's 50m 3 Position event. This achievement earned me a place in the ISSF World Cup in Munich, my first ISSF World Cup. I was excited yet apprehensive, as this would be the most significant competition I had ever faced. In preparation, I dedicated many hours to training while juggling my academic and work responsibilities. Upon arrival, I spent considerable time practicing on the range, adapting to the new setup, particularly the prone position, which is shot on a fold-out table something I was not accustomed to doing.

Shooting alongside many accomplished athletes, including Olympians and those preparing for the upcoming Games, was a great experience. I was particularly excited to compete with individuals whose shooting journeys I have long admired. I was very nervous heading into the competition, especially after seeing the results from the air rifle event, where a score of 630.0 only achieved 26th place in the women's qualification and 23rd in the men's. I ended the competition with a personal best score of 576 with 22 Xs and was particularly pleased with my standing series of 193. Although this wasn't quite enough to advance to the qualification round, I was pleased with my performance. The day was quite windy, requiring me to carefully watch and adjust for the wind and manage my time effectively to avoid running out of it.

TRV RBA CHAMPIONSHIPS

The inaugural TRV State Championships for RBA took place at the Frankston range on the 22nd and 23rd of June. There were five matches in total, with two weight classes of Air Rifle and three of Rimfire.

During an RBA match, all competitors shoot their first 25 shot card before moving to the second relay. After that, they shoot the third and final card. This allows all competitors to experience different range conditions and locations throughout the day, creating a more varied and engaging experience.

One of the benefits of this format is the social aspect. Since everyone competes across the day, there is more opportunity for conversation and camaraderie among participants. There were six competitors for light air rifle with Annette Rowe winning with a score of 738.34 from Marise Maccora and Richard Lightfoot. Darcie George won the Junior Medal.

Annette won the heavy air rifle competition with a score of 730.17, followed by Dennis Peacock and Brian Kent-Hughes. Meanwhile, Darcie George emerged as the Junior champion once again.

Moving on to the first rimfire class, International Sporter, Annette secured another victory with a score of 747.48. Kai Matczak came in second, and Scott Kiddle finished third. Kai also claimed the junior championship title. Notably, Scott achieved a perfect score of 250 with 19 X for the second card of the match.

Fourteen competitors participated in the light rimfire match on Sunday morning. David Garrett clinched the victory with a score of 747.47, just one point ahead of Scott Kiddle. Henry Lieng secured the third position, while Darcie George won the Junior championship. During this match, David, Scott, and Marise each shot a perfect 250.

In the heavy rimfire match that afternoon, David Garrett emerged victorious once again, scoring 747.54. Richard Lightfoot secured the second position with a score of 747.49, and Darcie George finished third with 747.46. In a remarkable display of skill, six competitors achieved a perfect score of 250 in this match - two by Wayne Bastin and one each by David Garrett, Richard Lightfoot, Darcie George, Richard Andrew, and Henry Lieng. Darcie also claimed the Junior champion title, with Alex Andrew and Kai Matczak following close behind.

A Gold medal was also presented for each of the aggregates.


