PARIS OLYMPIC GAMES JACK ROSSITER



2024 has been a big year for all of us that headed off to compete in Paris. Leading up to the Games in 2024 alone I have already done 16,700 shots and spent a lot of hours at the range training and competing. The year started with the selection matches in Sydney, Adelaide, and Rio de Janeiro after which I was selected to shoot both 10m men's air rifle and 50m men's 3 positions. I was away from home competing in World Cups, smaller Grand Prix and training camps from 4th April until 9th June. We had a short training camp at the end of June in Brisbane and then headed back overseas to Germany in early July for the pre-Games training camp. I felt that this was the best preparation I've had for any competition. I was at my peak from a technical standpoint, and I feel that my success throughout the competition season helped to prepare me for the tough competition ahead.





After arriving in Chateroux (the city where the shooting was held) training was limited but it was to be expected as this is usually the case with big championships. I'm happy with my performance across both events. I found it very hard to concentrate as well as I know that I could in air rifle, I shot a 9 on shot 39 and I looked back at my coach (Petr Kurka) who gave me a signal to try to speed up the shooting and focus on the rhythm. With this as my main focus it felt a lot easier to shoot well. My next series was 106.3 and even though I didn't feel fully in control I realised it was working, so I decided to just continue with it the best way I could. I finished the competition with 628.5 placing 16th which is an average result for me. I'm happy that I was able to perform close to my normal level at such a stressful competition.

The 50m competition felt less difficult in the beginning compared to the air rifle. We didn't train live fire 2 days before the competition because of the scheduling, so my main training in the few days prior to the competition was only dry fire. I was happy with how my sling positions went (195 kneeling, 199 prone) and I was confident heading into standing as it is in my opinion, my strongest position of the 3. I really struggled to find the same feeling in standing that I had days prior. I felt that for a while my standing had been on a high technical level and unfortunately, I couldn't replicate it on the day. It was likely because of the inability to focus, knowing that standing was the last position in the competition and that I was already on a good score from the first 2 positions. I finished with 191 points in standing, which is low given the weather conditions and where I believe my level is. At the end of the day, I had a total of 585 which I am happy with. I believe that I shot well in both competitions and I have to be happy that I performed close to my general level. Now I'm in Norway having a couple of weeks off and then looking forward to starting training again at the end of August to prepare for the competitions next season.

MISC GRAND PRIX DARCEE YOUNG

I live in regional Victoria so I travelled down to MISC on Wednesday to start training for the weekend. Friday I competed in 10m air rifle mixed teams, I was paired with Angela Breeze where we shot a combined 597.6 to place 5th. This is a fun event to start the weekend, it was great to share this with Angela in our first team event together.

Saturday was an early start with being at the range at 7:30am. Dad made me a big bacon and egg breakfast and then I had to lie down and shoot prone 2 hours later. Conditions were challenging with the gusty winds, this made the shoot harder as you had to be very conscious of where the wind was going. I was anticipating a better score for this shoot as during the lead up I had set a new PB.

Before the 10m air rifle event I had lunch and played card games with some of my friends from other states, while some took quick power naps. I felt comfortable going into the event as my training leading up had been showing an increasing score. I then had to contain my emotions as my score built to be my new PB, and with my finale 10 shots I started singing the nursey rime the itsy-bitsy spider to clear my head. I proceeded to then walk off the line with my best score of 616.6 and a smile. This score put me in the finale but due to the amount of pressure that I was putting on myself I was unfortunately first out.

On Sunday the final event that I competed in at the MISC grand prix was another 10m air rifle. I was aware of my performance yesterday and putting a lot of pressure on my self going into this event. I did 20 sights and in the words of Dad they looked like "Swiss Cheese". I was called off the line by my coach who gave me a peptalk and sent me back to the line. I then proceeded to shoot a 609.7 and in the last ten shots I started singing the duck song this time. This event challenged me to stay focused and contain my emotions to obtain a good score. Overall the weekend was a success and great to share with all of our shooting community.
